The 25th International Singing <u>Competition Competizione dell'Opera</u> takes place at the Bolshoi.

This year the Bolshoi hosts the competition for the third time.

The International Competition finals – at the Bolshoi New Stage – February 6.

12 participants made it to the finals, the Bolshoi Pokrovsky Chamber Stage soloist tenor Valery Makarov and baritone Rauf Timergazin (Bolshoi YOP member in 2018–21) among them.

Competizione dell'opera – one of the largest vocal competitions in the world and the only one where participants perform exclusively Italian and Italian-language opera repertoire in all its diversity: from ancient music to music of the 20th century.

The history of the competition dates back to 1996, when Prof. Hermann Rauhe, then the President of the Hamburg School of Music and Theatre, organised the *1st Cestelli Opera Competition*. Hans-Joachim Frey became the director of the competition.

Since 2001, the competition has been held in Dresden and it became international in 2011: Russia was the first to host it, at the Bolshoi New Stage.

The jury includes outstanding opera specialists, managers and casting directors, and many of the contestants later get the opportunity to take part in productions of the world's leading opera houses. Taking part in or winning the competition is only the starting point of young singers' interaction with *Competizione dell'opera*.





The Bolshoi Theatre celebrates the 110th anniversary of the birth of Boris Pokrovsky (January 23, 1912 – June 5, 2009), an outstanding opera director and teacher, theorist and practitioner, the Bolshoi chief director (1952, 1955, 1956–63, 1970–82) and the founder of the Chamber Musical Theatre, which, four years ago, become part of the Bolshoi Theatre as its Chamber Stage – with a festival.


Boris Godunov of January 26 was the 500th performance of the 1948 production.



«Francois Girard: 'Wagner Has Never Let Me Down'» Muzykalnaya Zhizn

«Francois Girard: Wagner Had Never Let Me Down» – Muzykalnaya Zhizn also publishes a detailed interview for the premiere, Katerina Novikova and Olga Rusanova talked to the director.

TVC channel prepared detailed material about the upcoming premiere of the opera *Lohengrin* by Wagner (February 24 – March 3, 2022). «The opera *Lohengrin* promises a grand show. There will be video projections and special lighting effects. Two hundred people on stage, one hundred musicians in the pit – all should become one.»

The material includes interviews with leading performers and directors of the upcoming premiere.

«Lohengrin for me is Wagner's shortest opera. /.../
The difficulty is that there are a hundred people in
the orchestra and 200 on stage. We must make all of them
sing unanimously so that the orchestra and choir become
one,» admitted conductor Evan Rogister. Evan started
working on Lohengrin with Canadian director Francois
Girard two years ago. For Girard, work at the Bolshoi
is a continuation of a project begun at the Metropolitan

where he staged Wagner's opera *Parsifal*, who, according to legend, is the father of Lohengrin.

«The team behind *Parsifal* is working on *Lohengrin*. We will have cinematic techniques, video projections, light. But we will change neither the text nor Wagner's music. Only add the outer sky to indicate the future,» said director Francois Girard. /.../

Johanni van Oostrum sings one of the main roles – Elsa. The singer performed this role for the first time ten years ago at the Weimar Theatre where Ferenc Liszt conducted the premiere of *Lohengrin* in 1850./.../ Evan Rogister dreams of rediscovering Wagner's *Lohengrin*, which hasn't been here since 1936, for the audience.»



Jacopo Tissi, appointed Principal Dancer of the Bolshoi Theatre, enters the Olympus of theatrical stars: the 26-year-old Italian has been promoted to principal dancer, the only foreigner in the highest rank of the legendary Russian classical ballet company of the Bolshoi Theatre.»

Dance Europe website features a video of Bolshoi principal dancer Jacopo Tissi. «The Italian dancer Jacopo Tissi has been promoted to principal dancer at the Bolshoi Ballet. Tissi was dancing with La Scala under the directorship of Makhar Vaziev and when Vaziev took over the direction of the Bolshoi Ballet, Tissi followed him there. In a interview with Amanda Jennings in London in 2019, he explained how this came about.»

Also, the DE website features a video of <u>Igor Tsvirko</u> who has been promoted to principal dancer at the Bolshoi Theatre. This video, made in collaboration with Andrei Uspenski, was shot during the company's last London season in 2019.

<u>Dance Magazine</u> (USA) publishes a brief report by Courtney Escoyne of the latest promotions, appointments and departures, as well as notable awards and accomplishments, from the last month. The article mentions, «At Bolshoi Ballet, Jacopo Tissi and Igor Tsvirko have been promoted to principal, David Motta Soares to leading soloist, and Elizaveta Kokoreva and Eva Sergeyenkova to first soloist.»

The Italian online opera news publication Connessi all'Opera publishes an article by Elsa Airoldi who reviews La Bayadere at La Scala giving the performance five stars out of five. «Svetlana Zakharova and Jacopo Tissi, étoiles of the Bolshoi, triumph at La Scala January 29, 2022.» «Tall, beautiful, thin legs but forged with steel, absolutely unbeatable in the classics, Zakharova has nevertheless collaborated several times with contemporary choreographers. This is to say that the beauty and skill shown last night at La Scala are not ends in themselves.» «He, Jacopo, is now twenty-six» «His perfect lines adapted to the characters of the Russian school. Which are speed, cleanness, open attitudes, high jumps, grand fouette en tournant forte. Beauty, therefore, is absolute perfection. But in addition, supported by his certainties, Jacopo now shows a charisma that he did not show before. ... Jacopo will grow up, but already in this way he is absolutely thrilling. The satisfaction rating of the packed Scala is uncontainable.»

The Italian online entertainment news publication Corriere dello Spectacolo publishes a review by Previtali Rosti of Nureyev's Bayadere at La Scala.» «Svetlana Zakharova Sublime Bayadere.» «Jacopo Tissi enters the scene showing nobility of bearing which, combined with an ideal physique for the role, makes him a proud Solor of credible expressiveness. Excellent partner, «carries' very well, but the holds are not always effective.» «He is endowed with elevation and a discreet ballon, but he must refine some aspects of his technique.»

The Italian local regional news publication La Provincia Pavese reports: «On Friday evening (28 January 2022), at La Scala, it will be Jacopo Tissi, from Landriano, recently appointed étoile of the Bolshoi dance troupe of Moscow, to dance, paired with his colleague Svetlana Zakharova, in Bayadère by Rudolf Nureyev with the score by Ludwig Minkus. For the 26-year-old a great return to the Milanese theatre, where he graduated, as an étoile of the ballet company of the Bolshoi of Moscow. A dream that has come true, in his case. In 2016, the young dancer from Landriano was in fact about to leave for Russia and join the dance company of the Bolshoi Theatre in Moscow. At the time, in an interview with our newspaper, he confessed that he had a great dream: to become a principal dancer of that ballet company so renowned all over the world.»

The Italian online news publication <u>Afaritaliani</u> publishes an article about Jacopo Tissi. «Who is Jacopo Tissi, the 26-year-old étoile of the Moscow Bolshoi at La Scala?»

Jacopo Tissi is the first Italian in history to be hired in one of the most important theatres in the world: the Bolshoi in Moscow» «Jacopo Tissi is a symbol of national pride and for this he must be celebrated: he is the first Italian in history to have been appointed by the Bolshoi of Moscow

as principal dancer. At the beginning of 2022 he was personally chosen by the Russian master Makhar Vaziev. He thus becomes étoile of the Moscow Bolshoi. After having danced as a Prince in Grigorovich's iconic *Nutcracker* on December 31, 2021 in Russia, he was chosen as principal dancer only a few days later, a sign of his truly unique talent.» «He returns to the La Scala theatre in Milan where he grew up professionally. Indeed, he will dance in tandem with his famous colleague Svetlana Zakharova on Friday 28 January in Rudolf Nureyev's *Bayadère* to the score of Ludwig Minkus.» «La Scala launches the new dates of the ballet premiere with the special guest Jacopo Tissi, returning to Piermarini from 25 to 29 January, for six performances, after the show had been suspended due to the outbreak of covid.»

Positano News publishes an article by Luigi De Rosa: «On January 30, and on Monday at the Auditorium Parco della Musica, Sala Santa Cecilia, «Les Étoiles», the international dance gala curated by Daniele Cipriani, former artistic director for dance of the Ravello Festival (from 2008 to 2010) and of Positano Premia La Danza Léonide Massine (from 2011 to 2015), gave birth to the Benois-Massine Mosca-Positano Prize twinned with the Prix Benois de la Danse, awarded for the first time in 2014 in Positano and Bolshoi Theatre in Moscow.»

The Australian dance magazine Dance Australia publishes an article about Yuri Grigorvich's 95th birthday. «The Bolshoi Theatre in Moscow is celebrating Yuri Grigorovich's 95th birthday. Grigovorich has a reputation as fabled and decorated as the theatre itself. From 1964 to 1995 he was principal choreographer, and from 1988 artistic director, of the Bolshoi Ballet, presiding over a turbulent chunk of the company's history.» «The Bolshoi's celebration takes the form of a festival of his works, beginning on January 2 (his birth date) and continuing to February 6. The many international artists sending him tributes include John Neumeier, Irina Kolpakova and Vladimir Semyonov, Julio Bocca, Natalia Makarova and Jiri Kylian (formerly Netherlands Dance Theatre).»

The online American magazine American Quarterly (USA) publishes an article by Cecilia Tornaghi about how ballet is helping Brazilian children. «Deep within Rio de Janeiro's sprawling Complexo do Alemão favelas, tutus and ballet slippers are helping young people stay in school – and thrive.» The project ViDançar stays closely connected to its students' traditional schooling.» The author writes about one student from the project: «At 13, Luis Fernando Rego's mother drafted him into taking his little sister to ViDançar classes. But then Rego was smitten, too. He joined the class, and quickly his natural talent led to a scholarship to the Bolshoi Ballet School in the Brazilian state of Santa Catarina. Before turning 19 last year, Rego moved to Denmark as a professional member of the Tivoli Ballet.»

The Moscow Philharmonic celebrated its centenary with large-scale concerts.

On January 29, the Philharmonic's birthday, a re-enactment concert was held at a matinee in the Conservatory Grand Hall, which repeated exactly the programme at the opening of the institution on January 29, 1922: Beethoven's 9th Symphony, Rachmaninoff's 2nd Piano Concerto, Scriabin's Poem of Ecstasy and works by Taneyev and Ipolitov-Ivanov. An anniversary gala concert was given in the evening at Tchaikovsky Concert Hall with the participation of conductor Valery Gergiev, Gustavo Dudamel, pianists Denis Matsuev and Daniil Trifonov, violinist Anne-Sophie Mutter, and other famous musicians. Audiences could also hear them playing on January 30. On this day, three concert programmes in a row were given at Tchaikovsky Concert Hall.

The Bolshoi Theatre sent congratulations to the General Director of the Moscow State Academic Philharmonic Alexei Shalashov:

«Dear Alexey Alekseevich! Dear friends!

Please accept our sincere congratulations on the 100th anniversary of the Moscow Philharmonic, one of the largest music organisations in the world. We are pleased to know that all these years of the Moscow Philharmonic's remarkable history are closely connected with the artists of the Bolshoi Theatre.

Opera soloists, outstanding musicians and conductors performed at the Philharmonic both in concerts and as part of subscription events.

Since 1920, Antonina Nezhdanova, Sergei Yudin, Faina Petrova, Valeria Barsova, Nadezhda Obukhova, Sergei Lemeshev and others have sung on the stage of the MUZO (the first name of the Philharmonic). This tradition has never been broken. Elena Obraztsova, Tamara Milashkina, Vladimir Atlantov, Makvala Kasrashvili performed at the Moscow Philharmonic.

When in 1928 the philharmonic symphony orchestra (Sophila) was organised, Nicolai Golovanov became one of its leading conductors. The future conductors of the Bolshoi Theatre Alexander Melik-Pashaev and, later, Kirill Kondrashin (the Philharmonic chief conductor in the 1960s) participated in the *First All-Union Conductors Competition*.


In 1953, the conductor Samuil Samosud organised and led the Moscow Philharmonic Symphony Orchestra which performed concert versions of *The Pagliacci* by Leoncavallo, *The Meistersingers* by Wagner, *The Enchantress* by Tchaikovsky and other operas. And after the war, when Ballet Evenings were held at Tchaikovsky Concert Hall, the leading artists of the Bolshoi Theatre often took part in them. In the mid-1960s, the country's first ensemble of early music was created, and Evgeny Svetlanov was appointed artistic director and chief conductor of the USSR State Symphony Orchestra.

We are happy that our musical friendship continues. In recent years, the symphony subscription of the Bolshoi Orchestra under the direction of Tugan Sokhiev has appeared in the Philharmonic repertoire.

Today it is impossible to imagine our country's musical life without the Philharmonic. Not only because it is largely thanks to you that the world has discovered the names of great musicians: Svyatoslav Richter, Mstislav Rostropovich, Viktor Merzhanov and others, Igor Stravinsky's tours and performances by the Vienna Philharmonic Orchestra conducted by Herbert von Karajan and many, many others took place on your stage, but because even today at your two venues, in your six halls, real active life blossoms.

The richness and variety of your timeline is incredible. Not only the renowned masterpieces of world classics, but also, new music is constantly performed within your walls. Using modern technologies, you have been successfully broadcasting your concerts for a long time, and these recordings are available to viewers all over the world. You are true illuminators, and hardly anyone in Moscow is as generous to their public as you are. And it returns your love.

On this festive day, we want to express our admiration for you, confess our love and wish the Moscow State Philharmonic Society further prosperity, creative inspiration and, of course, wonderful music – which you are so sincerely committed to. Happy anniversary!»


